Jesus' Coming Out Celebration: A Queer Arts Showcase



East End United Regional Ministry is proud to announce a unique event to celebrate the convergence of the Easter stories of Jesus and Queer Rights through an Arts Showcase. Jesus 'coming out' as he entered Jerusalem was celebrated with songs, palms, and shouts of Hosannah. Soon after, however, he was met with hostility, betrayal, and persecution. Jesus subsequent resurrection leads him into his true purpose, identity, and new life. The parallel experiences of Jesus coming out and that of queer folk are the springboard for this Queer Arts Showcase that will feature drag performers, poets, writers, and comedians. Visual artists will also be exhibiting their work in the creative space.
