<u>The Sleeping Car Porter</u> by Suzanne Mayr *Winner of the 2022 Scotia Giller Prize* Mayr portrays a black gay man living at a time where he is invisible in two ways.

The Queer Evangelist: A Socialist Clergy's

<u>Radically Honest Tale</u> by Cheri DiNovo This is a book chronicling Rev. DiNovo's path from living on the street at a teenager to becoming an ordained United Church Minister to becoming an NDP MPP. Rev. DiNovo performed the first legalized same-sex marriage registered in Canada in 2001 and helped pass pro-LGBTQ2 legislation during her time as an MPP.

A Dream of a Woman by Casey Plett

A collection of short stories revolving around transgender women who are looking for stability.

Red X by David Demchuk

Toronto author writes this novel about men disappearing from the gay village in Toronto. He explores how the scariest monsters in his community aren't imaginary but they are all too real.

The Well of Loneliness by Radclyffe Hall

First published in Britain 1928 and was caught up in a legal battle where it was judged to be obscene because it defended "unnatural practices between women". There were also court challenges in the U.S. It is a book which has over the decades inspired discussion and heated debate.

<u>All the Rage</u> - a memoir by Canadian playwright Brad Fraser The memoir is frank and witty but explores his unsettled childhood, experiencing prejudice around his gender identity and his life as an acclaimed but also controversial playwright.

Johnny Appleseed by Joshua Whitehead

Winner of Canada Reads in 2021. The book follows the life of a young two-spirit/Indigiqueer who becomes a cybersex worker to make a living.

Be a Triangle by Lilly Singh

The former late night TV host explores how to create inner peace in the midst of adversity. She explores her own struggles with identity, success and self-doubt. It's described as an uplifting guide to befriending yourself.

Funny Boy by Shyam Selvadurai

A boy's bittersweet passage to maturity and sexual awakening is set against escalating political tensions in Sri Lanka, during the seven years leading up to the 1983 riots.

Poetry

<u>Umbilical Cord</u> by Hasan Damir A collection of free-verse poems which chronicle Hasan's journey to fatherhood.

Untranslatable by Roxanna Bennett

Bennett explores being a queer poet living with a disability. It was shortlisted for the 2021 Governor General's Library Award for poetry.

Sulphurtongue by Rebecca Salazar

The collection explores how we create our identities and how they collide with complicate each other. Sulphurtongue was shortlisted for the 2021 Governor General's Library Award for poetry.

Plenitude by Daniel Sarah Karasik

A poetry collection which contemplates how we might dream of and build a future without police, bosses, prisons and gender regulation.

Swollening by Jason Purcell

Purcell writes poems explores living in a homophobic world as a queer person and the intersection of queerness and illness.

<u>Beast at Every Threshold</u> by Natalie Wee Natalie's poems look at otherness, queerness, diaspora and loss.
